FOREIGN RIGHTS

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Günişığı Kitaplığı marks three decades of publishing with its Fall 2026 Rights Catalogue, bringing together outstanding contemporary literature for children and young adults from Türkiye and around the world.

For its 30th anniversary, Günişığı Kitaplığı launches a special new collection, "Mysterious Adventures". **Suat Duman's** "Mars Vulpes" series begins with *The Missing Birdsong* and *Dare You*, while **Günay Gafur's** "Chaos Games" series opens with *The Butterfly Effect* and *Quantum Island*. Both series will continue with a third book in early 2027.

The award-winning Bridge Book collection reaches another milestone with its 30th title, *Tenderhearted*, by contemporary author **Figen Şakacı**.

Master author and illustrator **Behiç Ak's** much-loved "Chubby Books" series continues with its sixth title, *Chubby Doesn't Get Houses at All*, an exploration of the many ways we experience the places we live. **Kaan Elbingil** and **İrem Jung**, meanwhile, join forces for *Duru and the Darkling*, an illustrated story about facing the fear of the dark.

Canadian author **Vladimir Tumanov**, whose books have reached millions of readers in Türkiye, returns with *Far*, a thrilling adventure sparked by mysterious signals from deep space. Three more children's novels will follow before the end of the year: **Saliha Nilüfer's** *Torni's Musical Workshop*, **Ömer Açık's** *Stealing Bees* and **Melis Sena Yılmaz's** *Escape from the Mall*.

Acclaimed author **Sevgi Saygı**, joins the ON8 collection with her new novel *That Thing Called Life*, a powerful story of friendship, grief and violence.

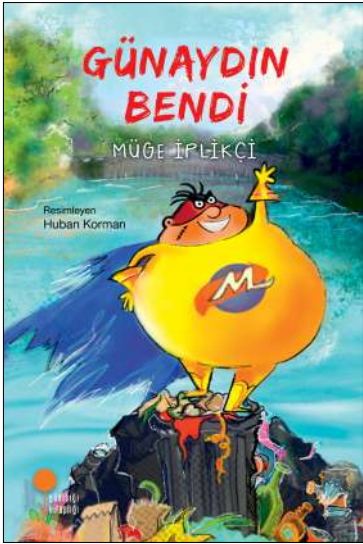
Who says a cat can't change the world?

The adventure, which also features a cat who loves the comforts of home but loves its owner even more, addresses the chain of neglect threatening our environment and emphasizes the importance of not remaining silent in the face of injustice. With a touch of humour, the novel highlights the value of taking responsibility.

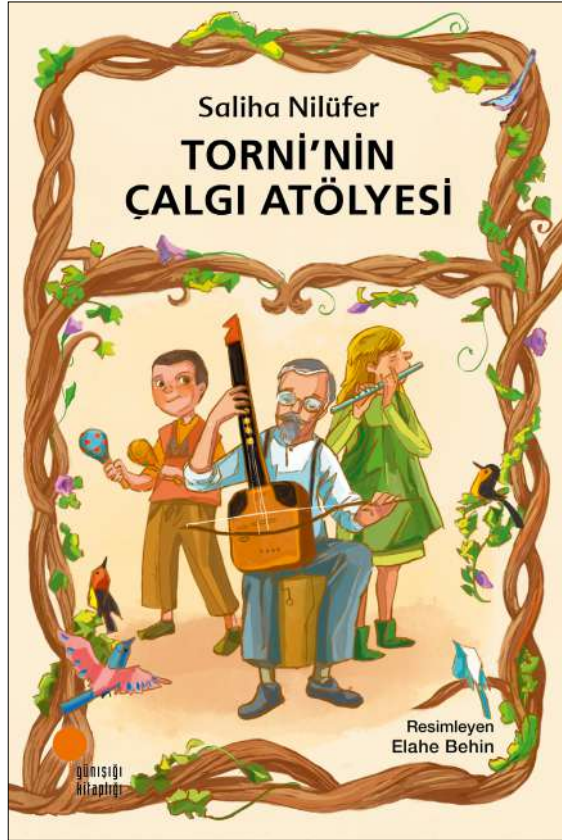

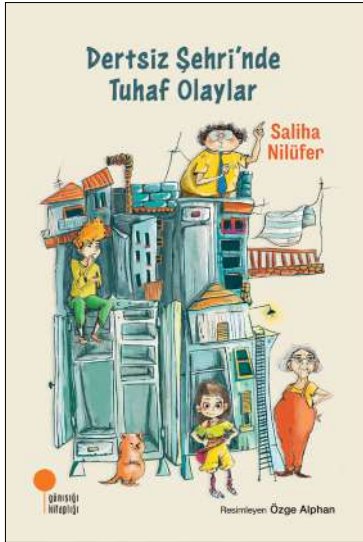
Plundering nature in the name of technology!

THE IDLENESS OF STARS

In his stories, which could be both funny and dramatic, Behiç Ak takes the reader on a journey through the labyrinths of memory. The book, consisting of extraordinary examples of the art of storytelling, where subtle humour is intertwined with compelling philosophy, holds up a mirror to lives that waver between the normal and the absurd. While showing that the ordinary can be surprising and unsettling, it takes truths, distorts them and turns them inside out. Among the pages that sometimes trace ludicrous or hilarious emotions, The Idleness of Stars Law in astronomy winks at us: "Every star maintains its most idle state and moves within those limits."

"My problem was this, you see, in no way could I manage to be what I was supposed to be. If I hired a cleaner, I'd soon find myself working alongside them; trying to rescue a detained friend, I'd end up getting detained myself; if a thief stole money from me, I'd feel like a thief stealing money..."

SLEEP CITY

Behiç Ak includes the rapidly evolving city that is becoming stagnant and rootless, in the narratives we inherit as we construct our identities. He articulates the silent reckonings of characters from three different generations through their intertwined stories, each questioning their role, home, street and often blaming the other. In three different locations of İstanbul, he sprinkles magic dust over the ordinary lives of three generations and gently tells their stories. Behiç walks through Sleep City, sometimes as a flaneur and sometimes as a time traveller, offering a lively and striking social perspective that is transforming into nihilism.

"Neglect and dust become a culture. Habit is the strongest force. Clouds sliding through the blinds, ferries, forgotten colours, slow songs from the past that even car cassette players can't carry, melancholy not invited to gatherings anymore, and the funny things that can only be laughed at when thought about for a long time are always there. Even stories banned for slowing down life..."
